For more than twenty years he has been working closely with state and national governments in the areas of mental health nursing research, teaching, practice and policy development, incorporating lived experience co-design, trauma informed practice and suicide prevention. Professor Procter was a member of the Minister's Council on Asylum Seekers and Detention between 2009-2018, and during that time chaired the independent Physical and Mental Health Sub-committee of the Joint Advisory Committee for the Governments of Australia and Nauru on the regional processing of asylum seekers. Professor Procter is currently Australia's national representative to the International Association for Suicide Prevention. Established in 1960 and with members in more than 70 countries, IASP is the largest international organisation dedicated to suicide prevention and to the reduction of suicide-related distress and loss.
